


- Compared traditional circle time to circle time with dramatic inquiry to support preschoolers with language delays
- Shifted pedagogical practice and language use in the classroom




Anderson et al. (2019)

Data Collection (fieldnotes, classroom videos, interviews, & documents)







(open- coding, multimodal interaction analysis (Norris, 2004), social network analysis, (Borgatti et al., 2002) and reflection)









